THE BRITISH LIBRARY THE CENTENARY OF THE PHILATELIC COLLECTIONS Presentation to the Royal Philatelic Society, London

On 2 October 1991, The British Library held a reception, partly sponsored by the Crown Agents, to celebrate the centenary of the formation of the Philatelic Collections.

The British Library is the custodian of over thirty philatelic collections, which form one of the greatest philatelic holdings anywhere in the world. The first collection bequeathed was the truly outstanding one established by Thomas Keay Tapling and presented on his death in 1891. Tapling was only 35 when he died but his collection was one of the best ever formed.

As part of the celebration of this historic landmark for the British Library, a limited revised edition has been published, jointly with The Printer's Stone Ltd, of Box 30, Fishkill, New York 12524, of the *Catalogue of the Crawford Library of Philatelic Literature at the British Library*. This reprint is of particular importance for two reasons. Firstly, it combines the original 1911 bibliography completed by Sir Edward Bacon with the 1926 Supplement and the 1938 Addenda, the last mentioned having originally appeared in THE LONDON PHILATELIST in March 1938. Secondly, the master copy used for this production is Sir Edward's personal copy, which is annotated (and corrected) in his hand, with shelfmarks added. The revised work consists of a 550-page hardbound folio Catalogue, which can be obtained from the British Library Publications Sales Unit, Boston Spa, Wetherby, West Yorkshire LS23 7BQ, for £115 postpaid (or from The Printer's Stone Ltd at \$225 postpaid).




Figure 2: Mr P.F. Berry (left, Managing Director, the Crown Agents), who is a member of the Tapling family, with Commander Michael Saunders-Watson (Chairman, British Library).
