In the second half of 2016 Mark Copley and I have prepared additional pdf documents to include on the web site. This involved OCRing the original files and reducing their size to enable them to be downloaded. Further, some of these files were greater than 10GB and needed to be split down into smaller portions. e.g the United States Post Office reports are split by year (1847 to 1906) and UPU annual reports split by year (1877 to 1909). This also involved changing the database index to reflect split.

We now have 62% of the records confirmed as out of copyright, for these, 83% have pdfs online, i.e. 51% of everything. Of the items deemed to be still in copyright, we have pdfs for 75% of them.

Paul Skinner is trying to track down the 'missing' pdfs/microfilms and we intend to examine the titles still deemed to be in copyright to try to release more to open access.

In addition, a new www.globalphilateliclibrary.org web site is being developed (for implementation later this year). This will provide a full text search of the OCRed contents of the pdf documents (subject to the accuracy of the OCRing).
