*. Nos. 385-514 were edited by R. T. K. Smith and the remaining numbers by Percy C. Bishop. There is a title page and an index for the year 1907 and also one for the year 1909. Nos. 387 and 389, 403 and 404, 407 and 409, 410 and 411, 412 and 415, and 416 and 417, were severally published together. There are no numbers for February and March, 1910, or for February, 1917. No. 473 is dated "Jan.-Feb. 1916"; no. 507, "July-Aug. 1917"; no. 513 "Feb.-Mar. 1918"; no. 514, "Apr.-June, 1918"; no. 519, "Nov.-Dec. 1918"; no. 524, "May-June, 1919"; no. 525, "Aug.-Sept., 1919"; and no. 527, "Oct.-Nov. 1919". The "Philatelic Societies' Record" was amalgamated with the journal commencing with no. 515. All the numbers were published in London and printed at Bath. An Index-volume for the years 1875-1910, compiled by B. T. K. Smith, was published by the Philatelic Literature Society for presentation to its members in 1915. The library contains a set of the twelve numbers, containing all the supplements of illustrations, bound up separately, and another set, wanting some of the illustrations in *Min. St. Jour.* 89 (2).

ATHENEUM. *London*, 1837-38. Add: No. 548, April 28, 1838. The review of "Minutes of evidence taken before the Select Committee on Postage" was continued in this number, pages 297, 298, and the first four and last four pages of the number were printed on paper with silk threads in the substance, which was first furnished by Mr. John Dickinson, the inventor. There is a file of the "Athenaeum" in the library of the British Museum under the Press Marks 2107. d-g. and 2108. a-f.

BAZAR. *Berlin*, 1862-64. Add note: *.* There is a second edition of this journal which has the philatelic articles in the numbers dated the 1st and 15th of the month instead of the 8th and 23rd. This second edition is wanting.

BLOTS. *Milwaukee, Wis.*, 1897. Fill in the name of the publishers: *Blots Publishing Company*, the size: 8" 7½ in., and the dates: September, October, 1897. Add to note: I have only seen No. 2, which has a coloured paper wrapper.

BOYS' AGENCY CIRCULAR. *Horsham*, 1866. Add to note: The following advertisement appeared about No. 8 in the "Boy's Own Magazine" of June, 1866. "Notice! Boys' Agency Circular. The business of this magazine will in future be carried on by Messrs. Laders, Rideing and Co., at 62 Albion Street, Everton, Liverpool. Send 3 stamps for June number (the third). The first two numbers are still in print. Advertisements only 1d. per two words."

BOYS' JOURNAL. The Boys' journal. A magazine of literature, science, adventure and amusement. Nos. 1, 2, January, February, 1867. [Contain an article "Paper coins and medals. By Messrs. Young and Stookall, Liverpool."] *London, W.C.*, *Henry Vickers*, 1867. 8" 8½ in. Pages 55-58 and 87-90.

. This article was reprinted in "The Philatelist" of Brighton, of February, March and April, 1867, with some illustrations added, and also in the "Stamp Collectors' Fortnightly" of London, of October 1, 16 and 29, 1910.

BOYS' OWN PHILATELIST. [Continued as:] The Canadian philatelic weekly. *Berlin, Ont.*, 1898-99. No. 18 is dated Dec. 29, not 28.

BOYS' PENNY MAGAZINE. The Boy's penny magazine. [Nos. 1-12, January to December, 1863, contain under "Notes and Queries" a good many references to stamp-collecting.] *London, W. C.*, *S.O. Beeton*, 1863. 8" 8½ in.

. After December, 1863, the title of the journal was altered to the "Boy's Monthly Magazine," which ceased publication with the December, 1867, number. All the forty-eight numbers of the latter and all but No. 1 of the "Boy's Penny Magazine" contain advertisements of stamps by dealers.

BOYS' PRIDE. *New York*, 1897. Fill in the name of the publisher: *George Fetting*, and the size: 8" 7½ in. Add to note: The double number 2-3, which is all I have seen, has the date "April and May, 1897".

BOYS' WORLD. *Haverhill, Mass.*, 1896-97. Add to note: Copies of vol. II, nos. 10, 12, 14 are also in the library, dated, respectively, Feb. 5, Feb. 19 and Mar. 5, 1897.

BRAZIL PHILATELICO. *Campos*, 1899-93. Add to note: No. 1, vol. I, is found printed in gold ink, as well as black ink. There is no copy of the former in the library.

BRIC-À-BRAC. *London* [?]—1906. Add to note: Vol. II, no. 117, August, 1879. Wanting. There is a copy of this in the philatelic library of Mr. F. A. Bellamy of Oxford.

BRIEFMARKEN-BÖRSE. *Rüttenscheidt*, 1895-96. Add to note: There is a supplement also to no. 6 of the first year.

BRIEFMARKENSAMMLER. *Leipzig*, 1890. Delete from note: "Wanting the reprint".

BUGLE. *Toronto, Ont.*, 1904. Fill in the name of the publisher: *F. W. Fisher*, the size is 24" x 5 in., and the date: April, 1904. Add to note. The number has a coloured paper wrapper. This journal was succeeded by the "Canadian Monthly".

BULLETIN. (Continued as:) *The Collector. Newburyport, Mass.*, 1894. Add: *Mis. St. Jour.* 167 (5a).

BULLETIN DE LA SOCIÉTÉ "L'UNION DES ÉCHANGISTES." *Paris*, 1898-1901. Delete: "Wanting the number for October, 1900," and add to note: The two numbers dated "November, 1900" can be distinguished from each other thus: one has at the top of the reverse page the words "Accusés de réception" and the other "changement d'adresse".

BULLETIN DES ANNONCES TIMBROLOGIQUES. *Alexandria*, 1898-99. Delete: "Wanting no. 6".

BULLETIN MENSUEL DE LA SOCIÉTÉ PHILATÉLIQUE LYONNAISE. *Lyon*, 1897-98. Add to note: No. 3 has a supplementary sheet of illustrations headed "Quelques lots du tombola". This is wanting in the file in the library.

BULLETIN MENSUEL DES PETITES ANNONCES DU COLLECTEUR. *Vienne*, 1899. Add: Nos. 1-3, April-June, 1899. Delete the wording of the note and substitute: The contents of nos. 1-2 consist entirely of advertisements. Add: *Mis. St. Jour.* 164 (10).

BULLETIN TIMBROPHILE. Delete the whole and replace by: **BULLETIN TIMBROPHILE.** Le Bulletin timbrophile. Journal mensuel de commission pour la vente des T. P. P. collections. *Château, S.-E.-U.*, G. Chénier, 1906. 8^o. 10 in. No. 1, January, 1906. *Mis. St. Jour.* 162 (9).

BUTLER PHILATELIST. *Butler, Pa.*, 1896. No. 1 only measures 34 inches.

CANADA STAMP JOURNAL. *Halifax, N.S.*, 1892. The date should be 1891. Add size: 8" x 7½ in. No. 1, May 6, 1891. Add to note: The number consists of a single leaf. It appears from the notice in the "Eastern Philatelist" that there must have been some idea of re-issuing the journal in 1892.

CANADA STAMP SHEET. *Toronto*, 1903-05. Add to note: No. 2, vol. V, is found with and without "Quebec" before the date "October 15th, 1903" on the front page.

CANADIAN COLLECTOR. (Continued as:) *The Canadian collector and philatelic punch. Berlin, Ont.*, 1899. The note should read: No. 2, which is oblong 16" x 4 in., has a coloured paper wrapper. No. 3, is 8" x 8 in., was published by E. A. Giller, has not the article "The" preceding the title and has no wrapper. Wanting no. 3.

CANADIAN MONTHLY. *Toronto, Ont.*, 1904. Fill in the name of the publisher: *F. W. Fisher*, the size: 12" x 5 in., and the dates: August, September, 1904. Delete the wording of the note and replace by: The only philatelic matter in the two numbers consists of reviews of the "Dominion Philatelist". No. 2 has a coloured paper wrapper. This journal succeeded the "Bugle". Wanting both nos.

CANADIAN YOUTH. *Toronto, Ont.*, 1904-05. Delete no. 1 fr. m those wanting. Add: *Mis. St. Jour.* 166 (15).
