- LITTLE CLIPPER.** *Mendota, Ill.*, 1887-89. Add size: 16^o. 6 in. or 8^o. 9 in. Add to note: The numbers I have seen are vol. III, nos. 2, 11, dated, respectively, June, 1887 and May, 1888 and vol. IV, nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, dated, respectively, July, Aug., Sept., Dec., 1888, Jan., Feb., 1889. Vol. III, no. 11, was published by G. M. Blakelee and Wells M. Cook and the numbers of vol. IV, by Wells M. Cook. Vol. III, no. 2, has a paper wrapper. The numbers of vol. III are 16^o. and those of vol. IV are 8^o.
- LITTLE DRUMMER.** *Midway, Minn.*, 1903. For "*Midway*" read "*Midway*". Add the name of the publisher: *Henry Norman*, and size: 8^o. 9 in. "No. 1" should be placed in brackets, thus [No. 1]. Add to note: There is a reference on page (2) to an earlier number.
- LITTLE GEM STAMP NEWS.** *Camden, N.J.*, 1898. Delete: "The" before the title. Add size: 8^o. 8^o in. and alter the date to: September, 1898. [Continued as:] Gem stamp news. Add: *Mis. St. Jour.* 167 (1a). [Continued as:] The New Jersey philatelist. Delete: "The" before the title. Add size: 8^o. 7^o in. Add to note: The number has a coloured paper wrapper with the article "The" preceding the title.
- LIVERPOOL STAMP ADVERTISER.** [Continued as:] The Liverpool and Newport stamp advertiser. *Newport, Mon.*, 1863-64. Add to note: Nos. 4-8 have the word "Advertiser" of the title misspelt "Advertiser".
- LIVERPOOL STAMP COLLECTOR'S JOURNAL.** *Liverpool*, 1865. Add: * * * There are two editions of no. 1. The first is printed on toned paper and has the word "quarterly" on page 8 misspelt "quartery". The second is on white paper, similar to nos. 2-3, and has the word "quarterly" correctly spelt. A copy of the second edition has been presented to the library by E. D. Bacon.
- LONDON AND PROVINCIAL STAMP ADVERTISER.** *London*, 1863. Delete: "Wanting" a copy having been presented to the library by E. D. Bacon. Only one other copy is known to exist.
- LUZ FILATELICA.** *Paris*, 1905-06. "19 nos." should read 24 nos. 2nd year should read: Jan.-Dec., 1906. Nos. 1-12. Add to note: Wanting nos. 8-12 of the second year.
