"Of the rates of postage charged upon letters between one part of the East Indies and another part of the East Indies, and between any British colony or possession and India, whether by packet or by private ship." "Of the rates of postage charged upon the conveyance of letters within each of the several British colonies and possessions." "And showing the gross amount of postage collected, the expenditure and the net revenue of the Post office in each of the British colonies and possessions, and in India, for the three years ended the 5th day of January 1848."
