- 1886, Aug. 10 (XIX, 449). "POSTES LÉVIQUES" — Foggiardo. (Reference to Bouteche Deschamps' *Cronos*, vol. XI.)
- 1886, Sept. 10 (XIX, 535) "POSTES AUX LETTRÉS" — A. D. [Reference to De Launay's *Études de l'Intermédiaire de Paris* and Brantôme's *Vie de Marichal de Sirost*.]
- 1886, Sept. 25 (XIX, 532) "POSTES AUX LETTRÉS" — Alexis Belloc. [Cites the edition of Louis XI., 13 Jan., 1454.]
- 1888, Feb. 10 (XXI, 71) "PLARON DE CHAMOUSSET" — Henri Isanchou. [The querist desires, for a new edition of his *Livre d'or des postes* (1885), which is to contain a Bibliography of the subject, information regarding Chamousset, the founder of the *Feuille* post.]
- 1888, March 10 (XXI, 184). Reply by Le ROSEAU, who notes Chamousset's *Cronos*, 2 vols., Paris, 1788.
- 1890, April 10 (XXIII, 194) "LES PREMIÈRES TIMBRES-POSTE" — V. D. [Are copies known to exist of de Valayer's postal covers? The question is put in view of an approaching International Exhibition of stamps.]

The dates inside each of these numbers are respectively "5-10 April, 1902," "5 November, 1902," and "Avril (sic) Mai, 1903." There are no numbers dated March, May, August or October, 1902. Commencing with no. 14 the journal was published by Luis de Mattos. The first six numbers are not entirely philatelic and only contain four numbers with the title "Section Philatélique," but commencing with no. 7 the numbers bear "Journal Philatélique." Nos. 12 and 13, 15 and 16, 18-23, 25 and 24 and 25-29 were severally published together. There is no number for September, 1894. Nos. 1-6, 14-29 and no. 37 have paper wrappers.
