

PRIVATE ACTS OF THE FIRST CONGRESS
OF THE
CONFEDERATE STATES.

Passed at the second session, which was begun and held in the City of Richmond, in the State of Virginia, on Monday, the eighteenth day of August, A. D. 1862, and ended on Monday, the thirteenth day of October, A. D. 1862.

CHAP. I.—*In Act to amend the "Act to authorize payment to be made for certain horses purchased for the Army, by Col. A. W. McDonald." Approved August 21st, 1861.* Sept. 30, 1862.

The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That the above recited act be amended so as to insert after the word "horses," wherever it occurs in said act, the words "and cavalry equipments." 1862, August 21.
Col. A. W. McDonald to be paid for cavalry equipments furnished for the Army.

CHAP. II.—*An Act for the relief of John Hunter, Collector of Customs and Agent of the Marine Hospital, at the Port of Natchez, Mississippi.* October 8, 1862.

The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized to audit the account of John Hunter, Collector of Customs, at the Port of Natchez, Mississippi, for money expended by him subsequent to the thirtieth of April, eight hundred and sixty one, on account of the Marine Hospital at that place, and allow so much thereof as may be shown to have been expended to meet the usual and proper charges of said hospital. Certain account of John Hunter, Collector of the Customs at Natchez, to be audited at the Treasury.
