aforesaid, or shall sell or attempt to sell the same, or shall briug any such note or notes into the Confederate States, or shall have any such note or notes in his posscssio:, with intent to pass or sell the same, shall, if captured, be put to death by hanging; and every commissioned officer of the enemy who shall permit any offence mentioned in this section to be committed by any person under his authority, thall be put to death by hanging. Every person charged with an offence punishable under ths act shall be tried by a military court in such manner, and under such regulations as the President shall preseribe; and, after conviction. the President may commute the punishment to imprisonment in such manner, and for such time, as he may deem proper, and may pardon the offender on such conditions as he may deem proper, or unconditionally.
