The Congress of the Confcderate States of America do enact, That all officers, non-commissioned officers and privates of any legally constituted military organization, whieh may have been aetually received into the service of the Confederate States by any general officer thercof, but were never legally mustered into service, in consequence of the loss of the muster rolls of sueh military orgauization, shall be entitled to reeeive pay from the time they were so received: Provided, The fact of their having been so received into the serviee, and the time they served, is duly proved to the satisfaction of the Secretary of War, under rules to be preseribed by him.
