Resolved, further, That the President be and he is hereby authorized to cause the several executive departments, with the archives thereof, to be removed at such time between this and the twentieth day of July next, as he may determine, to Richmond : *Provided*, however, That in case of any public emergency which may, in the judgment of the President, render it impolitie to meet in Richmond, the President shall have power by proclamation to call the Congress together at some other convenient place to be selected by him.
