PUBLIC ACTS OF THE PROVISIONAL CONGRESS

OF THE

CONFEDERATE STATES.

Pussed at the fourth session,* of the Provisional Congress, which was begun and held at the City of Richmond, on Tuesday, the third day of September, 1861, and ended on the same day.

STATUTE IV.

CHAP. I.—An Act to authorize the President to continue the appointments made by him, in the Military and Naval Service, during the recesses of Congress, or the last or present session, and to submit them to Congress at its next session.

The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That President authorized to continue the appointments made by him, rized to continue in the military and naval service, during the recesses of Congress, or appointments made by him in the during the last or present session, and to submit them to Congress at the military and naval commencement of its next session.

APPROVED September 3, 1861.

CHAP II.—An Act supplemental to an act to establish the rates of postage on newspapers and periodicals sent to dealers therein through the mails, or by Express over
post roads.

Sept. 3, 1861.

The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That Amendment of 2 the word "the" where it last occurs in the second section of said act 2 of act of 1861. be, and the same is hereby, stricken out, and the word "each" sub-tablishing rates of postage on newspapers, &c.
