Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to cause to be con-pelaware, for a structed a suitable brick building, with a fire-proof brick vault, at Dover, post-office. Delaware, for a post-office; and the sum of forty thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the purpose aforesaid, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated; and the Secretary of the Treasury shall cause proper plans and estimates to be made, so that no expenditure shall be made or authorized for the full completion of said building beyond mates. the sum herein appropriated: Provided, That no money hereby appropriated shall be used or expended until a valid title to the land for a site, be used until independent and unexposed to danger from fire in adjacent buildings, obtained and shall be vested in the United States, nor until the State of Delaware shall jurisdiction is cede its jurisdiction over the same, and also duly release and relinquish right to tax to the United States the right to tax or in any way assess said site or the released. property of the United States that may be thereon, during the time that the United States shall be or remain owner thereof.

CHAP. CLXXXIV. - An Act making Appropriations for the consular and diplomatic Service of the Government for the Year ending June thirty, eighteen hundred and seventyfour, and for other Purposes.

Feb. 22, 1873.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, That the following sums be, and the same are hereby, appropriated for the service of the fiscal year ending diplomatic appropriations for year the thirtieth of June, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, out of any ending June 30, money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the objects herein-1874. after expressed, namely:

For salaries of envoys extraordinary and ministers plenipotentiary to Envoys and Great Britain, France, Germany, and Russia, at seventeen thousand five ministers plenipotentiary. hundred dollars each, seventy thousand dollars.

To Spain, Austria, Brazil, Mexico, Japan, China, and Italy, at twelve thousand dollars each, eighty-four thousand dollars.

To Chili and Peru, at ten thousand dollars each, twenty thousand dollars.

For ministers resident at Portugal, Switzerland, Greece, Belgium, Netherlands, Denmark, Sweden and Norway, Turkey, Ecuador, Colom-dent. bia, Bolivia, Venezuela, Hawaiian Islands, and the Argentine Republic, at seven thousand five hundred dollars each, one hundred and five thousand dollars.

For minister resident accredited to Guatemala, Costa Rica, Honduras, Guatemala, lvador, and Nicaragua, to reside at the place that the President may Costa Rica, &c. 1872, ch. 194. Salvador, and Nicaragua, to reside at the place that the President may select in any one of the States named, as by act making appropriations for the consular and diplomatic service, approved May twenty-second, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, ten thousand dollars: Provided, That the pay and allowances of said minister resident shall hereafter be ten thousand dollars per annum, and no more.
