CHAP. LXIV. - An Act to fix the Time for holding the annual Session of the supreme Jan. 24, 1873. Court of the United States, and for other Purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized and required to pay to the county of Ontario, in the county of Onthe State of New York, in addition to the sum of twelve thousand building for dollars heretofore paid, the sum of eighteen thousand dollars, to the order court-house and of the treasurer of Ontario county, New York, for the perpetual use, post-office. repair and care of half of their court-house and post-office building, of which the United States now hold a lease, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
