## FORTY-THIRD

CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, AT THE FIRST SESSION, BEGUN AND HELD AT THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, ON MONDAY, THE FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, EIGHTEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

## AN ACT

Bevising and embodying all the Laws authorizing Post-Roads, in force on the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following are established post-roads: [See R. S. U. S., § 3694.]

The bridges across the Ohio River, at Wheeling, in West Virginia, and at Bridgeport, in Ohio, abutting on Zane's Island.

The bridge constructed at Steubenville, in Ohio, abutting on the Vir-

ginia shore of said river.

A bridge across the Mississippi River between Dunleith, in the State 25 July, 1866, c. of Illinois, and Dubuque, in the State of Iowa, built with the consent of 246, ss. 3, 9, v. 14, said States. said States.

A bridge across the Ohio River from the city of Cincinnati, Ohio, to 191, 8. 5, v. 16, pp. the city of Newport, Kentucky, built by the Newport and Cincinnati Bridge Company.

A draw-bridge over the Connecticut River, at or near Middletown, in the State of Connecticut, built by the New Haven, Middletown and Willimantic Railroad Company.

A draw-bridge built over the Connecticut River by the Shore Line

Railway Company.

A bridge authorized to be constructed by "An act giving the consent of the United States to the erection of a bridge across the Delaware River between Philadelphia and Camden," approved April sixth, eighteen hundred and seventy.
