CHAP. 405.—An act to authorize the construction of a bridge across the Mississippi June 22, 1874. River at or near the city of La Crosse, in the State of Wisconsin.

CHAP. 406.—An act supplementary to the act entitled "An act to incorporate the Texas Pacific Railroad Company, and to aid in the construction of its road, and for 1871, ch. 122, vol. other purposes."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United Railroad Company States of America in Congress assembled, That the Texas and Pacific authorized to secure Railway Company is hereby empowered to secure, by one or more mort-construction bonds gages upon the whole or any portion of its line, the construction bonds by new mortgages.
