That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to pay, out of any gheny Valley Railmoney in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated to the Allegheny road Company. money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to the Allegheny Valley Railroad Company, the sum of seven thousand two hundred and thirty-two dollars and seventy-five cents, a balance due to said company as per account balanced upon the books of the Post-Office Department, for transportation of the mails in the years eighteen hundred and sixtyeight and eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, which cannot be paid until an appropriation is made therefor; the balances of the appropriations for those years having been covered into the Treasury under the provisions of the act of July twelfth, eighteen hundred and seventy.
