

Nov. 6, Oct. 23, 1877. *Additional article of agreement between the Post-Office Departments of the United States of America and Newfoundland.*

SOLE ARTICLE.

Exchange money-order mail, free.

To facilitate the exchange of money-orders between the United States and Newfoundland, it is agreed that all money-orders mailed at the exchange offices of the United States and addressed to payees in the colony of Newfoundland, shall be transmissible in the mails between the two countries free of postage.

Commencement and duration.

This article shall take effect immediately, and shall have equal duration with the postal convention of 20-30 November, 1872, and with the additional articles of agreement concluded thereto.

Done in duplicate and signed at Washington the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and at St. Johns the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.
