**CHAP. 311.**—An Act Granting a pension to Emily McLain.Emily McLain.  
Pension.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to place upon the pension roll the name of Emily McLain, widow of M. T. McLain, late a private in Captain Samuel Moore's Company, D, First Arkansas Volunteers Mounted Gun Men, eighteen hundred and thirty-six (called out for the protection of the Sabine frontier), and pay her a pension of eight dollars per month.*

**CHAP. 312.**—An Act Granting a pension to Judith Doherty.Judith Doherty.  
Pension.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension roll, subject to the provisions and limitations of the pension laws, the name of Judith Doherty, widow of William F. Doherty, late a corporal in Captain Russell's company, First Regiment Volunteer Mounted Gunmen, West Tennessee, Indian war of eighteen hundred and eighteen, and pay her a pension at the rate of eight dollars per month.*

**CHAP. 331.**—An Act Granting a pension to George Hughes.George Hughes.  
Pension.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, directed to place on the pension rolls, subject to the provisions and limitations of the pension laws, the name of George Hughes, late a soldier in the Mexican war, at the rate of twenty-five dollars per month, in lieu of the pension he is now receiving under certificate ten thousand five hundred and seventeen.*

**CHAP. 332.**—An Act To increase the pension of Mrs. Letitia Tyler Semple.Letitia Tyler Semple.  
Pension increased.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension roll the name of Letitia Tyler Semple, widow of the late James A. Semple, a paymaster of the United States Navy, at the rate of thirty dollars per month, in lieu of the pension she is now receiving.*

**CHAP. 333.**—An Act To reimburse George W. McKinsey, postmaster at Kokomo, Indiana, for money paid out by him as said postmaster.George W. McKinsey.  
Payment to.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and is hereby, authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to George W. McKinsey, postmaster at Kokomo, Indiana, the sum of six hundred and twenty dollars and twenty cents, said amount being paid out by him as such postmaster for clerk hire, rents, gas, light, and fuel, all of which was necessary to carry on and conduct properly the business of said post-office.*
