**CHAP. 4.**—An Act Validating homestead entry of Mike Campbell for certain public land in Alaska.

December 15, 1921.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the entry hereinafter described be, and the same is hereby, validated and the Secretary of the Interior is authorized to issue patent thereon upon the submission of satisfactory proof of compliance with the provisions of the Act of June 6, 1912 (Thirty-seventh Statutes, page 123):

Homestead entry, Juneau, Alaska, numbered naught thirty-nine hundred and eighty-six, made by Mike Campbell on July 14, 1919, for the west half of the northwest quarter, the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter, and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter, section thirty-six, township thirteen north, range four west, Seward meridian, and in lieu of that tract, the Territory of Alaska shall have the right to select equal area of public land of the character subject to selection under its school land grant.

**CHAP. 5.**—An Act For the relief of John Cestnik, junior.

December 15, 1921.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Northern Pacific Railway Company, upon its filing with the Secretary of the Interior a proper relinquishment disclaiming in favor of the United States all title and interest in or to the south half of the southwest quarter, section eleven, township eight south, range twenty east, in the Bozeman, Montana, land district, under its mineral indemnity selection, list numbered one hundred forty-six, embracing said tract, shall be entitled to select and receive a patent for other vacant unreserved non-mineral public lands of an equal area in that State; and the Secretary of the Interior is hereby authorized and directed to permit, after the filing of such relinquishment by said railway company, the homestead entry of John Cestnik, junior, to remain intact as though said entry had been properly allowed, the same to remain subject to compliance with the laws governing entries of like character.

**CHAP. 6.**—An Act For the relief of G. Fred Roach and others.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That G. Fred Roach, who made desert-land entry Salt Lake City serial naught sixteen thousand five hundred and fifty-two for the east half southeast quarter, southwest quarter southeast quarter, southeast quarter southwest quarter, and the west half southwest quarter of section thirteen, and the east half southeast quarter section fourteen, township twenty-one south, range five west, Salt Lake meridian; Grant H. Geddes, assignee of Richard S. Webber, who made desert-land entry Salt Lake City serial naught sixteen thousand five hundred and sixteen for the north half section twenty-four, township twenty-one south, range five west, Salt Lake meridian; A. William Malone, who made desert-land entry Salt Lake City serial naught sixteen thousand five hundred and seventeen for the south half section twenty-four, township twenty-one south, range five west, Salt Lake meridian; and Mabel S. Roach, who made desert-land entry Salt Lake City serial naught sixteen thousand five hundred and fifty-three for the northeast quarter, east half northwest quarter, and northeast quarter southwest quarter section twenty-five, township twenty-one south, range five west, Salt Lake meridian, all of which entries were allowed on April 6, 1916, be, and they are hereby, authorized to complete title to the lands embraced in their respective entries upon the payment of any balance unpaid of the sum of \$1.25 per acre for the lands so entered to the receiver of the United States land office at Salt Lake City, Utah, within ninety days from the approval of this Act.

**CHAP. 12.**—An Act To authorize the Secretary of Commerce to convey to Augustus S. Peabody certain land in Galveston County, Texas.

Augustus S. Peabody.  
Conveyance to, of abandoned lighthouse lands, in Texas City, Tex.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of Commerce be, and he is hereby, authorized to convey by quitclaim deed to Augustus S. Peabody, of Chicago, Cook County, Illinois, grantee of all rights, title, and interest of the Texas City Company, all the following described tracts or parcels of land in Galveston County, Texas, known, designated, and described as follows, to wit: Being a part of lot numbered nine, in block numbered forty-seven, first division of the town of Texas City, Galveston County, Texas, and beginning at the southwest corner of said lot numbered nine; thence north along the west line of said lot forty-seven feet to a corner; thence east at right angle twenty-five feet; thence south along the east line of said lot forty-seven feet; thence west with the south line of said lot twenty-five feet to the place of beginning. Also that certain tract or parcel of land, being a square of fifteen feet, and being a part of Bay Street, in the town of Texas City, Galveston County, Texas, and beginning at a point sixty-two feet east of the east line of block nine, first division of said town of Texas City, and seventy-eight feet north of the southeast corner of said block nine; thence north fifteen feet; thence east fifteen feet; thence south fifteen feet; thence west fifteen feet to the place of beginning; all of which tracts or parcels of land were granted and conveyed to the United States by the Texas City Company in May, 1906, for the nominal consideration of \$1 for each tract, and which land was to be used as site for beacons or ranges to mark the Texas City Channel; said tracts of land being no longer needed for the purposes for which they were conveyed, in view of the abandonment of said beacons

or ranges formerly established or intended for use upon such tracts: *Provided*, That such conveyance shall be made without expense to either party, except that the said Augustus S. Peabody shall pay a consideration of \$2 and such expenses as are incident to the preparation and recording of the necessary title papers for the purpose of obtaining title to the said tracts and sites upon which beacons or shore ranges were established.

**CHAP. 35.**—An Act To confirm private land claim of the widow and heirs of Joseph Etier.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That the private land claim of the widow and heirs of Joseph Etier, numbered two hundred and forty-three, class five, in the report dated December 30, 1815, of the register and receiver at Opelousas, Louisiana, acting as commissioners on land claims in the western district of the State of Louisiana, which has been surveyed and segregated as section forty, township thirteen north, range four east, Louisiana meridian, containing six hundred and sixty-eight and seventy-seven one-hundredths acres, shall be, and the same is hereby, confirmed, and the Secretary of the Interior shall cause patent to issue for said land to the widow and heirs of Joseph Etier, their heirs, assigns, or legal representatives: *Provided*, That this Act, and the patent which may be issued in pursuance of the same, shall only operate as a relinquishment on the part of the United States, and shall in no way prejudice any valid adverse right, if such exist, to the said land; the intent being that title shall inure to the true owners of the land under the laws of Louisiana, including the laws of prescription, in the absence of any interest or estate of the United States.

**CHAP. 36.**—An Act Granting to certain claimants the preferential right to purchase certain alleged public lands in the State of Arkansas, and for other purposes.

Whereas certain lands in Poinsett County and Mississippi County, in the State of Arkansas, namely, those portions of sections one, two, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, eighteen, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-seven, twenty-eight, thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, township ten north, range seven east, in Poinsett County, and sections twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three, township ten north, range eight east, in Mississippi County, Arkansas, shown in the official surveys as Tyronza River, Dead Timber Lake, and lake on the official plats of these townships, have been, by Executive order, temporarily withdrawn from settlement, location, sale, or entry in order to adjust claims of patentees against the United States and among themselves arising from alleged incomplete or erroneous surveys; and

Whereas the land office, upon investigation, has found that the greater part of these lands in question have been put in cultivation down to the water's edge by parties who thought they had title to them and have been paying taxes on many of these lands, and the land office is now making a resurvey, and will replat these areas at the request of said adjacent landowners: Therefore

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That M. M. Want, as trustee for the owners, their heirs, administrators, or assigns, of lands adjacent to those portions of sections one, two, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, eighteen, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-seven, twenty-eight, thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, township ten north, range seven east, in Poinsett County, and sections twenty-nine, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three, township ten north, range eight east, in Mississippi County, Arkansas, shown in the official surveys as Tyronza River, Dead Timber Lake, and lake on the official plats of these townships, which have been, by Executive order numbered thirty-one hundred and twenty-three issued on July 19, 1919, temporarily withdrawn from settlement, location, sale, or entry in order to adjust claims of patentees against the United States and among themselves arising from alleged incomplete or erroneous surveys, is hereby granted preferential right at any time within ninety days after the passage of this Act and the filing of the plats of a corrected survey of said lands in the United States land office at Little Rock, Arkansas, to purchase said lands of the United States of America and to pay for the same at the rate of \$1.25 per acre, and said purchase shall be in trust for said adjacent landowners, and, that upon the issuance of said patents to said trustee, he shall forthwith convey to each of the said adjacent landowners that portion of said lands which may lie adjacent to his lands upon the payment by said party of his proportionate part of said purchase price and entry fees for the same, and in case either of said lakes or said river may be the boundary line between two adjacent owners, then, if they have not otherwise agreed upon a line of division, the center of said lake or river shall be the boundary between said adjacent landowners: *Provided*, That if any person, in good faith, may have located and settled upon any portion of these lands prior to the Executive order withdrawing said lands from such location and settlement, then nothing in this Act shall be construed to deprive said party of any rights he may have gained by said location and settlement.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Interior is hereby authorized and directed to sell to Charles R. Powell, within a period of ninety days from and after the passage of this Act, at the original purchase price, the southwest quarter of section thirty-five, township two south, range thirteen west, Indian meridian, Cotton County, Oklahoma, and issue to him a patent therefor.

**CHAP. 38.**—An Act Authorizing the Secretary of the Interior to sell and patent to J. D. Calhoun, of Lincoln Parish, Louisiana, certain lands.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized to sell and patent to J. D. Calhoun, of Lincoln Parish, Louisiana, the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter section thirty-four, township nineteen north, range two west, Louisiana meridian, situated in the parish of Lincoln,

State of Louisiana, at not less than \$1.25 per acre, land which he and his grantors have occupied under claim and color of title, and of which they have had the actual possession, beneficial use, and enjoyment, believing themselves to be owners in good faith for more than thirty years: *Provided*, That application for the purchase of the described tract of land under this authorization be filed at the United States land office at Baton Rouge, Louisiana, within ninety days after the passage of this Act, and that no adverse claim thereto be officially of record as pending when the application is allowed and the sale consummated: *Provided further*, That the entry which may be made and the patent issued under the provisions of this Act shall be subject to and contain a reservation to the United States of all oil, gas, and other minerals in the land so entered and patented and with the right to prospect for, mine, and remove same.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized to pay to the William Gordon Corporation such sum, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, not exceeding \$8,000, as he may determine will compensate the said corporation for furnishing temporary heat to the Interior Department Office Building as a result of the extension of time on their contract.

Grace and Company paid as customs duty on one hundred and eighty bales of caraway seed, which was imported on May 15, 1918, the entry on which was liquidated on August 10, 1918, and which was reported for exportation by the Department of Agriculture on November 13, 1918, after the expiration of the thirty-day period provided by law for the filing of protests after liquidation of entry.

**CHAP. 61.**—An Act For the relief of the owners of the schooner Charlotte W. Miller.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the claim of the owners of the schooner Charlotte W. Miller for damages alleged to have been caused by collision between said schooner and the United States steamship D-2 in the forenoon of Tuesday, July 31, 1917, about two miles east of Cornfield Shoal Lightship, in Long Island Sound, and subsequently on the afternoon of the same day and thereafterwards further injured so that she became a total loss, because the United States steamship Ontario took charge of the sunken schooner, relieving the salvors of the owners then in charge thereof, and herself attempted to tow said sunken schooner to New London, Connecticut, may be sued for by the owners of the said schooner Charlotte W. Miller in the District Court of the United States for the district of Rhode Island sitting as a court of admiralty, and acting under the rules governing such court, and said court shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine such suit and to enter a judgment or decree for the amount of such damages and costs, if any, as shall be found to be due against the United States in favor of the owners of the said schooner Charlotte W. Miller or against the owners of said schooner Charlotte W. Miller in favor of the United States and upon the same principles and measures of liability as in like cases in admiralty between private parties and with the same rights of appeal: *Provided,* That such notice of the suit shall be given to the Attorney General of the United States as may be provided by order of the said court, and it shall be the duty of the Attorney General to cause the United States attorney in such district to appear and defend for the United States: *Provided further,* That said suit shall be brought and commenced within four months of the date of the passage of this Act.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the claim of Gaetano Davide Olivari fu Fortunato, managing owner of the Italian bark Doris, against the United States for damages alleged to have been caused by collision between the said bark and the United States collier Jupiter in Chesapeake Bay on the 17th day of October, 1916, may be sued for by the said Gaetano Davide Olivari fu Fortunato in the District Court of the United States for the Eastern District of Virginia, sitting as a court of admiralty and acting under the rules governing such court, and said court shall have jurisdiction to hear

May Jernegan, widow of Warren G. Jernegan, late of the Hospital Corps, United States Army, War with Spain, and pay her a pension at the rate of \$125 per month in lieu of that she is now receiving: *Provided,* That one-third of the pension allowed by this Act shall be for the benefit of the child until he shall reach the age of twenty-one years.

**CHAP. 434.**—An Act For the relief of Frances Kelly.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Interior be, and hereby is, authorized in his discretion to issue patent to Frances Kelly for one hundred and sixty acres of nonmineral unreserved public lands of the United States within the State of Idaho, in lieu of lands described as follows: The west half of the east half of the east half of the northwest quarter and the west half of the east half of the northwest quarter, of section thirty-two, township thirty-five north, range two east, Boise meridian, for which patent was issued her upon her final homestead certificate, but which it subsequently appeared was partly included in the land patented under Indian allotments numbered eleven hundred and thirty-three

and eleven hundred and thirty-four, in the Nez Perces Indian Reservation: *Provided, however,* That the Secretary of the Interior shall have alternative authority to cancel the trust patents issued for said Nez Perce Indian allotments numbered eleven hundred and thirty-three and eleven hundred and thirty-four, and to issue in lieu thereof new trust patents, subject to the conditions contained in the original trust patents as extended, eliminating only the west ten acres of each of said allotments in conflict with the homestead patent to Mrs. Kelly; to determine damages and compensate the heirs for such loss in an amount not to exceed in all \$1,000.
