**CHAP. 7.**—An Act for the relief of Edward C. Roser.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized and directed to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Edward C. Roser, who, while an employee of the Post Office Department, personally conducted a voluntary campaign of postal employees of the Grand Central Station, New York City, in theaters, restaurants, and other places, which resulted in the sale of war-savings stamps to the amount of \$1,256,000, the sum of \$737.50 as reimbursement for losses which he sustained, without negligence on his part, as a result of unavoidable mistakes incident to such sale.

**CHAP. 11.**—An Act For the relief of Isaac A. Chandler.

Chandler, who was a private in Troop A, Fourth United States Cavalry, shall hereafter be held and considered to have been discharged honorably from the military service of the United States as a private of said troop and regiment on the 17th day of December, 1875: *Provided,* That no bounty, pension, pay, or allowances shall be held as accrued prior to the passage of this Act.

**CHAP. 13.**—An Act For the relief of A. S. Rosenthal Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the claim of A. S. Rosenthal Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, and engaged in the business of importing silks in the city of New York, in said State, for

damages for the loss and nondelivery of one case of silk belonging to said company while the said case of silk was in the custody of the United States at the United States appraisers' stores in the city of New York, in October or November, 1914, and for the duty paid or secured to the United States thereon, be referred to the Court of Claims, with jurisdiction and authority to hear and determine the same to judgment, with the right of appeal as in other cases: *Provided*, That no suit shall be brought under the provisions of this Act after six months from the date of the passage thereof.

**CHAP. 14.**—An Act For the relief of the Broad Brook Bank and Trust Company.

Broad Brook Bank and Trust Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to redeem in favor of the Broad Brook Bank and Trust Company, Broad Brook, Connecticut, United States coupon note numbered H-1728011 in the denomination of \$1,000 of the Victory Liberty loan 4¾ per centum convertible gold notes of 1922-23, with coupons due December 15, 1922, and May 20, 1923, without presentation of the said note or the coupons, the note with the coupons attached having been lost or destroyed while being held as collateral by the said the Broad Brook Bank and Trust Company: *Provided*, That the said note shall not have been previously presented and paid and that payment shall not be made hereunder for any coupon which shall have been previously presented and paid: *Provided further*, That the said the Broad Brook Bank and Trust Company shall first file in the Treasury Department of the United States a bond in the penal sum of double the amount of the principal of the said note and the interest which had accrued when the principal became due and payable in such form and with such surety or sureties as may be acceptable to the Secretary of the Treasury to indemnify and save harmless the United States from any loss on account of the lost or destroyed note and coupons hereinbefore described.

Andrews, who was a private in Company H, One hundred and forty-fifth Regiment Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, shall hereafter be held and considered to have been discharged honorably from the military service of the United States as a private of said company and regiment on the 26th day of June, 1865: *Provided*, That no bounty, pay, or allowances shall be held as accrued prior to the passage of this Act.

**CHAP. 69.**—An Act To correct the military record of Daniel C. Darroch.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That in the administration of the pension and homestead laws and the laws governing the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, or any branch

thereof, Daniel C. Darroch shall hereafter be held and considered to have been honorably discharged from the military service of the United States as a private of Company B, Fifty-first Indiana Volunteer Infantry, on September 15, 1863: *Provided*, That no back pay, pension, bounty, or allowances shall accrue prior to the passage of this Act.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That in the administration of the pension laws, Levi Wright, who served as a private in Company A, Fifty-fourth Regiment Ohio Infantry Volunteers, from September 5, 1861, to January 7, 1865, shall hereafter be held to have been discharged honorably from the military forces of the United States on January 7, 1865, but no pay, bounty, pension, or other emolument shall accrue prior to the enactment of this Act.

**CHAP. 71.**—An Act To remove the charge of desertion from and correct the naval record of Louis Nemeck, otherwise known as Louis Nemeck.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That the Secretary of the Navy be, and he is hereby, authorized to review the naval record of Louis Nemeck, otherwise known as Louis Nemeck, late boatswain's mate, second class, United States Navy, assigned to United States ships Richmond, Hartford, Vermont, Buffalo, Kearsearge, Hancock, Buffalo, Cleveland, Monterey, Albany, and receiving ship at Mare Island, and remove the charge of desertion now standing against him, and to grant him an honorable discharge from said service, and to change the records so that his name will appear thereon from his first enlistment to his final discharge, as Louis Nemeck.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled*, That section 14 of "An Act to provide for the creation, organization, administration, and maintenance of a Naval Reserve and Marine Corps Reserve (Forty-third Statutes at Large, page 1084), approved February 28, 1925, shall be applicable to the case of Alexander Edward Metz, former lieutenant, United States Naval Reserve Force, for injury received by him in United States ship Eagle Numbered 51 on or about July 24, 1924: *Provided*, That it shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of said section that he was physically in the line of duty while performing active duty, authorized training duty with or without pay, or was employed in authorized travel to or from such duty.

**CHAP. 73.**—An Act To authorize Lieutenant Commander Lucius C. Dunn, United States Navy, to accept from the King of Denmark a decoration known as a "Knight of the Order of Dannebrog."

Dunn, of the United States Navy, be, and he is hereby, authorized to accept from the King of Denmark a decoration known as a "Knight of the Order of Dannebrog," which was bestowed upon him by His Majesty the King of Denmark on September 17, 1921, which decoration has been transmitted by the Navy Department to the State Department, where it remains awaiting Congress to authorize the acceptance of same.

Leville, of Suffolk County, Massachusetts, dependent mother of the late Nelson Arthur Leville, carpenter's mate, second class, which pay would have been paid by Act of Congress approved June 4, 1920, but for omission through ignorance or error of the son to designate beneficiary before he died in the service.

Dabel, who on October 29, 1919, was struck by a Government motor cycle and side car on the streets of San Francisco, resulting in serious injuries and long confinement in a hospital, the vehicle in question being driven by an employee of the motor transport general depot, San Francisco, California.

**CHAP. 108.**—An Act For the relief of Frederick Marshall.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That in the administration of any laws conferring rights, privileges, and benefits upon honorably discharged sailors, Frederick Marshall, who enlisted in the United States Navy, October 22, 1862, and served on the Cyane and Lancaster as an ordinary seaman, shall hereafter be held and considered to have been discharged honorably from the naval service of the United States on the 21st day of October, 1865: *Provided,* That no back pay, pension, allowance, or other emoluments shall be held accrued prior to the passage of this Act.

**CHAP. 117.**—An Act For the relief of Stanton and Jones.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That Stanton and Jones are hereby authorized to bring suit against the United States under contract with the engineer's office, dated June 12, 1918, for revetment work, Pelican Bend, Missouri River, to recover whatever damages or losses which they may have suffered through action by governmental agencies in commandeering, purchasing, moving, or causing to be moved from the Missouri River the fleet of the Kansas City Missouri River Navigation Company, or of any other action of governmental agencies which resulted in any loss to the claimants. Jurisdiction is hereby conferred upon the Court of Claims of the United States to hear, consider, and determine such action and to enter decree or judgment against the United States for the amount of any loss or damages as may be found to have been suffered by the said Stanton and Jones under the said contract, if any: *Provided*, That such action shall be brought and commenced within four months from the date that this Act becomes effective.

**CHAP. 120.**—An Act To relinquish the title of the United States to the land in the claim of Moses Steadham, situate in the county of Baldwin, State of Alabama.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That all the right, title, and interest of the United States in and to that certain land in Baldwin County, Alabama, known as the Moses Steadham Tract, section 50, township 2 north, range 2 east, and section 42, township 3 north, range 2 east, Saint Stephens meridian, Alabama, be, and the

CHAP. 526.—Joint Resolution For the relief of Katherine Imbrie.

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed to pay to Katherine Imbrie, widow of Vice Consul Robert Whitney Imbrie, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$30,000 as compensation to her for the physical and mental suffering resulting from an attack upon her at Teheran, Persia, on July 22, 1924. The acceptance of this sum by Katherine Imbrie shall be in full settlement of all claims or demands for personal injuries suffered by her and for the death of her husband.
