## RESOLUTIONS.

[No. 1.] - A Resolution for the Appointment of Regents in the Smithsonian Institution.

Dec. 19, 1848.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the vacancies in the board of regents of the Smithsonian Institution, of the class vacancies "other than members of Congress," be filled by the reappointment of how to be filled. the late incumbents, viz., Rufus Choate, of Massachusetts, and Gideon Hawley, of New York.

[No. 2.] — A. Resolution relating to the Compensation of Persons appointed to January 6, 1849. deliver the Votes for President and Vice-President of the United States to the President of the Senate.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That so much of an act entitled "An Act making appropriations for the civil and diplomatic expenses of government for the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and for other purposes," as limiting the con-relates to the compensation to be all and the compensation the compensation to be all and the compensation to the compensation to the compensation to the compe relates to the compensation to be allowed persons appointed by the electors of any State to deliver to the President of the Senate a list of the votes for President and Vice-President, be, and the same is hereby, repealed; and that the messengers appointed under the operation of the clause hereby repealed, who bore, or may hereafter deliver, the votes cast in the presidential election of eighteen hundred and fortyeight, shall be entitled to demand and receive the same amount that they would have been entitled to had the act approved August twelfth, of compensation one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, not passed. Approved, January 6, 1849.
